

Collington Pool Rules

General: These rules and policies have been adopted by the Association to ensure the equitable use, enjoyment and safety of all Collington residents and invited guests using the pool. This is a family amenity. Please respect the privileges and safety of all. Each person is responsible to abide by all the rules. Comments and complaints concerning the pool or the lifeguards should be directed to the pool committee by emailing them at pool@CollingtonHOA.com

Lifeguards: The lifeguards are present to supervise pool operations and ensure the safety of all swimmers. They are responsible for the enforcement of all rules described herein and have the authority to dismiss anyone from the pool if their actions are judged to be hazardous or inappropriate in any manner. Failure to comply with such dismissal, until it can be addressed by a member of the pool committee and the lifeguard's supervisors, may justify a longer suspension. This will not be reduced even if the original issue is resolved completely in the swimmer's favor. Conversations with lifeguards should be kept to a minimum. LIFEGUARDS ARE NOT BABYSITTERS, nor are they expected to clean up after guests.

Age Group Admissions:

- Adults: Must be in good standing with HOA. May bring guests of any age.
- 11-17: Must be in good standing with the HOA. Allowed admission without adult supervision (swim test may be administered before allowed in pool without adult resident). May bring one guest within the same age group.
- 10 and under: Only allowed admission with an adult or 11 – 17 age group resident. This age group may not bring guests.

Rules and Policies

1. OBEY THE LIFEGUARDS AT ALL TIMES!
2. The pool is the private property of the Association. Only Collington residents and invited guests may use this amenity.
3. Residents must have a pool pass for admission. This will be strictly enforced. All residents are required to check in at the gate.
4. Residents must be in good standing with the HOA for admission. Questions regarding account standing should be directed to ACS West.
5. Persons using the pool do so at their own risk. The Association is not responsible for any injury, nor is it responsible for lost, stolen or damaged property.
6. Pets are not allowed.
7. The lifeguards may close the pool at any time in consideration of the health and safety of the swimmers including the onset of inclement weather.
8. Abusive or profane language or breach of peace will not be tolerated.
9. No loud music may be played at the pool. Only handheld music devices are allowed.

10. Proper attire MUST be worn on the property at all times. No cutoff shorts or street clothing in the pool.
11. You may not enter the water with open sores, poison ivy, or other infectious or contagious conditions.
12. Running, pushing, and rough play in any form is prohibited.
13. Wagons may be allowed in the pool area at lifeguard's discretion.
14. **Glassware or breakable items within the pool area is prohibited. There is ZERO tolerance for this and you will be subject to a fine which includes but is not limited to the cost associated with draining, cleaning, and refilling the pool. You and your household's pool privileges will be suspended for the remainder of the season.**
15. Smoking while in any pool area or the clubhouse is prohibited.
16. Trash and/or food must be disposed of within the proper receptacles.
17. Pool furniture is available on a first come/first serve basis. Chairs are to be used for pool side sitting, not for storage. **The chairs may not be used in the splash park features or taken from the pool deck.**
18. Only lifeguards and authorized personnel are allowed inside the filter room.
19. Lifejackets, noodles, or kick boards may be allowed in the pool only at the lifeguard's discretion and with their express permission. Water toys are permitted in the splash park. Water guns and tennis balls are prohibited in the pool. Pool floats (rings or mats) must be transparent.
20. Flips from the side of the pool are prohibited. No diving is allowed. No riding on shoulders. No playing on ladders.
21. Children who cannot swim must be within arm's reach of a parent or responsible adult who is in the water. The use of floatation devices does not negate this rule.
22. All diaper dependent guests must wear an approved swim diaper. Parents are asked to have all children use the toilet facilities prior to entering the pool and explain the sanitary importance thereof.
23. In the case of solid fecal, loose stool or vomit: The pool or splash park will be cleared of all swimmers. Fecal matters will be removed as much as possible. The entire pool will be "shocked" with either liquid or granular chlorine. The pool will remain closed for at least two complete turnovers. This process will take a minimum of 2 hours
24. The splash park is NOT under the direct supervision of the lifeguards. A parent or responsible adult must accompany a child under the age of eleven (11) in the splash park at all times.
25. There will be a ten (10) minute safety break called on an hourly basis at the discretion of the lifeguards. Children under the age of seventeen (17) must exit the pool immediately and will not reenter until given permission by the lifeguards. Children are not allowed to sit on the ledge in the shallow end during this time.
26. The pool will not close for parties (e.g. birthday parties or private parties) that are during normal pool hours. It will, however, be closed for all Collington Community functions. Guests will not be permitted admission during such closures.

27. No one is allowed in the pool area after hours with the exception of private parties who have received prior permission and rented the pool after hours (contact the Clubhouse Coordinator for more information).
28. Trespassing or vandalism on pool property will result in suspension of pool privileges and possible criminal prosecution.
29. The swim lane is for lap swimming only. If a resident wishes to swim laps, they may ask a lifeguard at any time to clear the lane.
30. The Association has the right to revoke or refuse admission and suspend privileges of any person or household failing to comply with any rules for an indefinite term. Progressive action is applied when appropriate and at the Association's discretion depending on the particular circumstances.
31. The Association has the right to amend these rules and policies without notice.

Guest Policy:

Residents in good standing with the HOA may bring guests to the pool. The resident must remain at the pool with their guest(s) at all times. It is the responsibility of the resident to ensure guest(s) understand and comply with all pool rules. If guest(s) fail to follow pool rules, the guest and resident may be subject to suspension of pool privileges.

The cost for admission will be:

- ALL Days Except Holidays: Residents of Collington may bring up to four (4) guests daily, excluding holidays. Additional guests will be two dollars, (\$2) each with a maximum of 6 guests daily.
- Holidays – No guests
- Nanny pass - \$75 for the pool year

Guide to Collington ID Badges

 <p>A badge with a white background is a resident over 17. They have guest privileges as needed.</p>	 <p>A badge with a green background is a resident age 11-17 and are restricted to 1 guest.</p>	 <p>A badge with a yellow background is a resident 6-10 and have no guest privileges and must be accompanied by a Collington resident at all times.</p>	 <p>A badge with a candy stripe background is a nanny pass and must have a resident with a green or yellow background with them anytime they are in the pool. The address code on the badge should match the resident.</p>	 <p>A badge with a pink background is for club house rental. They do not have pool privileges unless you are specifically advised by the clubhouse manager.</p>
